After a successful initial release for Apple devices earlier this fall, the Midday Prayer App was expanded for Android devices in November.

Putting the finishing touches on the new headquarters

As the year comes to a close, the last touches are being made on the new Youthfront headquarters and we couldn't be more excited about the potential this building holds. The building is perfectly designed to facilitate the kind of youth ministry needed as we move into the mid-21st century.

The new headquarters will feature nearly 30 private offices for our Kansas City based staff, along with several workstations for our staff visiting the office from our other ministry locations. The office will have more than a dozen collaborative work spaces, a beautiful prayer chapel, two outdoor patios, a reading/study room, four conference rooms of various design, a kitchen, dining room, two large custom glass dividers that open space for larger training and meeting areas, and access to other meeting spaces adjacent to our headquarters.

Lansing Correctional Facility was host to a Youthfront Something to Eat "Cone Zone" packing party through a special partnership.

Incarcerated individuals participating in the Brothers in Blue Reentry program had the opportunity to pack meals for people struggling with food insecurity through a Something to Eat Cone Zone meal packaging party. Brothers in Blue Reentry is a program inside Lansing Correctional Facility that gives men an environment for inner change and equips them to function as husbands, fathers, and citizens upon release. Brothers in Blue offers an intensive, voluntary faith-based program within a supportive Christian community inside Lansing.

Youthfront has had a partnership with Brothers in Blue, whose members helped produce temporary meal bags for Something To Eat earlier this year, but had never had the opportunity to host a packing party themselves. That day came on Friday, Oct. 5, 2018.

"We're really grateful to the staff at Lansing and to the leadership of Brothers in Blue for making the day possible," said Mike King, CEO at Youthfront. "We've had an important relationship with this program, and our entire staff has visited them in prison. Youthfront has provided scholarships for many of the inmates' children to come to our camps. The inmates have volunteered to work on projects for us to help further our mission to impact the lives of young people, so it was a huge blessing to be alongside them this day."

Members packed 4,000 meals, which were distributed to Convoy of Hope in Springfield, Missouri. Youthfront's Something to Eat program is available to groups large and small who want to fight food insecurity. Since 2009, partygoers have packaged more than 4.3 million meals that have been distributed to food pantries around the United States and Puerto Rico.
